Environment

When the Bresnahan School was built in 2014 it was deemed GREEN. What is a green school? It means that the Bresnahan earned a designation as a green school from the Massachusetts Collaborative for High Performance Schools because it was designed, built and operates in a manner that is environmentally sensitive and provides a healthy and comfortable learning environment for students. Not only are the lights and other equipment energy efficient, but materials for the building were purchased from regional sources to minimize trucking distances, lighting levels in classrooms are controllable and appropriate for learning, equipment is located so noise is not an issue in classrooms and water usage is minimized, among many other criteria.

Keeping with our green school guidelines we would like to remind parents of our district cleaning policy. The policy was drafted due to concerns that several ingredients in commercial cleaners such as Clorox wipes and Wet Ones can be harmful and toxic. The chemicals in question are found to trigger asthma, allergies, endocrine disruption and other health concerns. Many of our parents had reached out last year to discuss the concern with the non-green cleaners or wipes being used in the classroom. It was with this great discussion and research that the current policy for classroom cleaning was drafted and instituted.

The green cleaner we use is called PC120. This is the only cleaner approved to be used in the classroom setting. PC120 cleaner (*Green Seal certified) is a peroxide based cleanser teacher that may only be used by adults in the building. This product meets the Green Seal TM environmental standard for industrial and institutional cleaners based on its reduced human and aquatic toxicity and reduced volatile organic compound content, with skin and eye irritation and acute toxicity met at the as-used dilution.

Over the years, we have become accustomed to asking parents for help with wish-list items including tissues and wipes. The only wipes that can be used in the school setting are Seventh Generation wipes. These wipes are used to clean surfaces and may be used to cleanse students' hands when soap and water is not available before and after eating.
